Monday, June 8 Overnight flight to Italy Our pilgrimage begins with an overnight flight from your local airport to Rome! (Bring a good book, your rosary, and prayer intentions.) Meals and refreshments are served on the plane.

Tuesday, June 9 Arrive & afternoon at leisure Welcome to Rome! After gathering our bags and meeting our amazing tour manager, Marika, we will enjoy a "get yourself acquainted" bus tour of the eternal city. We then arrive at our hotel where we will have some time to unpack and freshen up for our pilgrimage welcome dinner in the evening. Overnight in Rome.

Wednesday, June 10 A day at the Vatican
After breakfast, we're off to Saint Peter's Square for the Papal general
audience with Pope Francis (subject to the Pope's schedule). Following a
short lunch break, we'll tour the Vatican Museum, Sistine Chapel, and St.
Peter's Basilica. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Thursday, June 11 Papal Basilicas tour
Following breakfast, we will visit the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls,
the Church of St. Mary Major, as well as the Archbasilica of St. John
Lateran where we'll have an opportunity to prayerfully climb the Lateran
Steps. After a short break for lunch, we will travel to the Pontifical North
American College for a private tour of the Catholic institute training
seminarians to become future priests for U.S. dioceses. Dinner and

Friday, June 12 Basilicas & the Pantheon

After breakfast this morning, we'll start the day at Saint Cecilia's Basilica.

We'll continue our sightseeing tour with a visit to the Basilica of St.

Bartholomew and the Museum of the Holy Souls in Purgatory. After some leisure time, and a delicious scoop of Italian gelato together at the Piazza Navona, we'll make our way to visit the Basilica of St. Bartholomew, home to Caravaggio's The Calling of Matthew, a masterpiece by Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio, depicting the moment at which Jesus Christ inspires Matthew to follow him. We will continue our tour at the Church of Saint Maria sopra Minerve where we'll view and pray at the tomb of St. Catherine of Siena, a philosopher and theologian who had a great influence on the Catholic Church. We'll continue onto the Pantheon, which boasts the largest dome of its kind in the world, and the Church of the Gesù, the mother church of the Jesuit Order. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Saturday, June 13 Footsteps of Ancient Rome
Following breakfast, we travel back in time with a historic tour of Ancient
Rome. Making our way along centuries-old cobblestone streets lined
with Rome's stately stone pines, we arrive at the triumphal Arch of
Constantine, built in 315 AD after Constantine's victory over Maxentius.
Under one hundred feet away stands Ancient Rome's monumental,
where we tour the three-tiered Colosseum, an amphitheater once used
for gladiatorial games. We continue to the Roman Forum, open grounds

now surrounded by the ruins of the ancient government buildings at the center of Ancient Rome. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Sunday, June 14 Welcome to Assisi
Following breakfast this morning, we transfer by private motor coach to the hilltop village of Assisi, the birthplace of Saint Francis of Assisi and a UNESCO world heritage site known for its magnificent medieval architecture. Upon arriving, Jon and Marika will take you up to the mos beautiful view of the city. After our hotel check-in, we will gather for prayer. Dinner and overnight in Assisi.

Monday, June 15 Basilicas of Assisi tour
Following breakfast, we will gather for our guided tour of Assisi. We begin at the Basilica of Saint Clare, one of the first followers of St. Francis. Here, we will descend to St. Clare's lower crypt, where we will pray before her incorrupt body and reflect before many of her relics that remain with us today. We will also have a chance to pray before the San Damiano cross, the very cross that Christ spoke to St. Francis through, asking Francis to rebuild his Church. Continuing to the Basilica of Saint Francis, we will be guided through the meaning of the many frescoes that surrounds us, depicting his saintly life. We will then have an opportunity to descend to the lower crypt where we will pray before the tomb of St. Francis, and the remains of his first followers. In the afternoon, we will make our way down into the valley of Assisi where we visit the beautiful Basilica of Saint Mary of the Angels, home of the Chapel Portiuncula, where St. Francis lived and worked after founding the Franciscan order, and where Mother Mary appeared to Francis in 1216. We will then visit the miracle garden of the thornless rose bush. Dinner and overnight in Assisi.

Breakfast will be served at our hotel this morning. "All roads lead to Rome" (and so does our pilgrimage). We say farewell to Assisi as we arrive back into the Eternal City. On our return, we'll visit the ancient Catacombs of Rome where Mass will be celebrated in an underground chapel. Dinner on your own this evening and Overnight in Rome.

Wednesday, June 17 Basilica's & Churches
After we enjoy breakfast, we're off to the Basilica of Saint Peter in Chains where we'll have the opportunity to view the chains that held St. Peter while he was in the Mamertine prison in Rome. After some time for prayer, we'll visit the Church of Saint Alphonsus Ligouri, home of the original icon of Our Mother of Perpetual Help. We will then make our way to visit the Saint Gregorio al Cielo Convent, the Roman motherhouse of the Missionaries of Charity. It is here where Saint Teresa of Calcutta resided when she visited her sisters in Rome. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

Itineraries: Itineraries are prepared and scheduled in advance according to the best information available at the time and are subject to change by the date of the pilgrimage.

Pricing: Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. reserves the right to adjust pricing should the following occur; (1) Rise in Airfare due to higher fuel costs, etc. (2) Rise in ground costs due to increases in hotel charges, bus fares, fees, taxes and other costs due to the fluctuating value of the U.S. dollar against foreign currency.

Deposits and final Payments: A deposit of \$450 per person is required to hold your reservation of which \$200 is non-refundable (may be refundable under travel insurance conditions). Final payment is due 75 days prior to the departure date. Payment can be made by credit card or check. Credit card payments are subject to a 3% processing fee. Call (800) 653-0017 to make a credit card payment.

Cancellation fees: If cancellation in writing is received by Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. more than 75 days prior to departure all payments made toward the price of the tour will be refunded, less a \$200 processing fee. For cancellations received less than 75 days prior to departure, the initial deposit of \$450 plus any applicable charges imposed by the airlines, hotels, and bus companies on Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours will be non-refundable. Please note that the amount may vary with each pilgrimage and the vendors we work with. Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. retains the right to cancel any pilgrimage up to the departure date in which case all funds received will be returned with-in 10 business days.

Baggage: Please follow the general rule of traveling light- If you cannot carry it do not bring it. Passengers are permitted one piece of luggage per person. Baggage handling is included for one suitcase per person only, whenever possible, in the cost of the pilgrimage. The airlines for international flights will not allow a suitcase exceeding 50 pounds (subject to change), if over 50lbs., the fees can be costly. On inter-European flights, which are not directly connected to a transatlantic flight the baggage weight limit is lower. We will provide you with this information in the final travel documents. Baggage handling is not available on any of the trains. Every effort will be made to handle luggage carefully, however Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. will not assume any liability for lost or damaged luggage or items inside luggage carrier. (Travel insurance may apply)
