Your Chaplains

Tuesday, March 14: Our pilgrimage to the Holy Land begins as we board our flight for Israel today.

Wednesday, March 15: Upon arrival in Tel Aviv, we'll meet our Canterbury tour manager at our hotel in Tel Aviv for check-in and dinner.

Thursday, March 16: Following breakfast, we will drive to Caesarea. We will visit the archaeological remains of this ancient port. Continue North to Haifa. In Haifa, you will find Stella Maris, a Carmelite Monastery. The monastery is located above the cave where Elijah, the prophet, once lived. Following this visit, enjoy the scenic drive to Nazareth, where we'll visit the Church of the Annunciation. Tradition identifies it with the workshop of St. Joseph and the house of the Holy family. We will continue with a visit to the Church of the Incarnation, viewing the remains of the house of the Blessed Virgin where the Angel appeared and announced the good news. Following Pilgrims path we visit Mary's well, where often the Virgin Mary would have walked to draw water from the spring. The next stop will be to Cana where you will visit the Franciscan Wedding Church. Couples will have the opportunity to participate in the ceremony to renew their wedding vows. We'll continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, and check-in at the guest house before dinner.

Friday, March 17: Today we begin with breakfast at the hotel, followed by a boat ride on the beautiful Sea of Galilee. Upon docking the boat, you will have the opportunity to view the remains of a boat that dates back to the time of Jesus. Following the Sea of Galilee, we continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus proclaimed His great Sermon on the Mount. Near the Mount is Tabgha, where Jesus fed the crowd of 5,000 people from five loaves of bread and two fish. We'll also visit St. Peter's Primacy where Jesus bestowed church leadership upon Peter. Continue to visit the birthplace of Mary Magdalene in Magdala. Our day concludes at Capernaum, the launching place of Jesus' ministry. In Capernaum, visit the Synagogue where Jesus taught and gave His sermon on the Bread of Life. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Saturday, March 18: After breakfast, we will drive to the site of the Transfiguration, Mount Tabor. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Transfiguration. Continue south to the Jordan Valley to the oldest inhabited city in the world, Jericho. In Jericho, we can view the exact location of the Mount of Temptation, where the Devil tempted Jesus. We'll continue to Jesus' baptismal site on the Jordan River where you will have the opportunity to renew your baptismal vows. After some time at the Jordan River, we will transfer to Jerusalem to check-in to our guest house and enjoy dinner.

Sunday, March 19: This morning, enjoy breakfast before we start our day in Jerusalem. Visit a model of the Second Temple as it was in the time of Jesus. Following this visit, we will take a short drive to the village of Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist. In the afternoon, transfer to Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus. In Bethlehem, you will have the opportunity to view the Shepherd's Fields. The tour concludes at the Manger Square

which stands in front of the Church of the Nativity. Following Mass in this Sacred space, return to the hotel for dinner.

Monday, March 20: Following breakfast, we will travel down the Jordan Valley to Qumran. Qumran is made up of 2,000 year old ruins from the days of the Second Temple and also the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. Time and weather permitting, you will have the opportunity to take a float in the Dead Sea, the lowest spot on earth. Continue as you travel through the Judean wilderness, the site where Jesus spent 40 days of fasting. We'll end our day in Bethany, the site where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Tuesday, March 21: After breakfast, we will make our way to the Mount of Olives where you will be able to take in the beautiful, panoramic view of Jerusalem. Historically, the Mount of Olives was a mandatory transit point for Jesus during many iconic moments. Visit the Pater Noster Shrine where Jesus taught His disciples the Lord's Prayer. You will have the opportunity to stop at Dominus Flevit which is a Church that commemorates where Jesus wept for Jerusalem. Continue on to Gethsemane, a garden at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Jesus brought His disciples here to pray the night before He was crucified. The Garden still contains trees with roots that date back to the time of Jesus. Next we'll stop at the Church of All Nations, built over the "Rock of Agony". This is where Jesus prayed alone on the night of His arrest. Throughout this time, pilgrims are invited to remain in prayer and to reflect on Christ's agony that He experienced. We'll also have the opportunity to visit the Western Wall, which is the last remnant of the Jewish Temple after it was destroyed in 70 A.D. Next we'll visit the Upper Room on Mt. Zion where Jesus and His disciples celebrated the Last Supper and where Jesus appeared to His disciples after His Death and Resurrection. In addition, visit the nearby Benedictine Church of the Dormition. Tradition tells us that this Church is where Mary, the Mother of Jesus, "fell asleep." Return to hotel for dinner.

Wednesday, March 22: This morning we'll begin the Via Dolorosa at the Antonia Fortress, where Jesus was condemned to death by Pontius Pilate. We'll end by Celebrating Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Following Mass, we will return to the hotel to enjoy breakfast. We will continue our day with a visit to the Church of St. Anne's, the home of Jesus' maternal grandparents (Anne and Joachim) and the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the crippled man. This afternoon, enjoy a revisit to the Old City. Following this visit, return to the hotel to enjoy dinner. With a renewed sense of pilgrimage and an invigorated love of our Catholic faith, we say farewell to our fellow pilgrims as the pilgrimage comes to a close this evening.

Thursday, March 23: Arrival back into the USA.

Terms of Service

Itineraries: Itineraries are prepared and scheduled in advance according to the best information available at the time and are subject to change by the date of the pilgrimage.
Pricing: Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. reserves the right to adjust pricing should the following occur; (1) Rise in Airfare due to higher fuel costs, etc. (2) Rise in ground costs due to increases in hotel charges, bus fares, fees, taxes and other costs due to the fluctuating value of the U.S. dollar against foreign currency.
Deposits and Payments: A deposit of \$450 per person is required to hold your reservation of which \$200 is non-refundable (may be refundable under travel insurance conditions). Payment can be made by credit card or check. Call (800) 653-0017 to make a credit card payment.
Final payments: Final payment is due 75 days prior to the original departure date except in the case of postponement. The original departure date is a date of departure for which a new reservation is intended. In the event of postponement, if the decision of postponement is made sooner than 75 days prior to the original departure date, final payment will be due 75 days prior to the new departure date. If the decision of postponement is made 75 days prior to the original departure date or later then the payment remains due 75 days prior to the original departure date.
Cancellation fees: If the traveler's written notice of cancellation is received by Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. more than 75 days prior to the original departure date all payments made toward the price of the tour will be refunded, less a \$200 processing fee. For cancellations received 75 days or less prior to the trip; departure, the initial deposit of \$450 plus any applicable charges imposed by the airlines, hotels, and bus companies on Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours will be non-refundable. Please note that the amount may vary with each pilgrimage and the vendors we work with. In the event of postponement, the above still applies. Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. retains the right to cancel any pilgrimage up to the departure date in which case all funds received will be returned within 10 business days.
Baggage: Please follow the general rule of traveling light - If you cannot carry it do not bring it. Passengers are permitted one piece of luggage per person. Baggage handling is included for one suitcase per person only, whenever possible, in the cost of the pilgrimage. The airlines for international flights will not allow a suitcase exceeding 50 pounds (subject to change), if over 50lbs., the fees can be costly. On inter-European flights, which are not directly connected to a transatlantic flight the baggage weight limit is lower. We will provide you with this information in the final travel documents. Baggage handling is not available on any of the trains. Every effort will be made to handle luggage carefully, however Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. will not assume any liability for lost or damaged luggage or items inside luggage carrier. (Travel insurance may apply)
Travel insurance: We strongly recommend the purchase of travel insurance (personal accident/illness/injury/trip cancellation/baggage insurance). Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. disclaims responsibility for accidents, personal illness or injury, trip cancellations, or handling of baggage not under our control.
